
The Mirabella Civic Engagement Project is writing to support LIHI's proposal to develop and operate two Tiny House Villages, and in particular the village proposed for 145 Yale in South Lake Union. We say, "Yes! in our Back Yard". We have offered not only financial support to develop the village, but also a commitment to support its integration into Mirabella's on-going community volunteer operations.


We appreciate that KCRHA is prioritizing a project in South Lake Union where the need is urgent. The site at 145 Yale is well suited for a Tiny House Village. The Mirabella Civic Engagement Project has been working with the City of Seattle, Councilmember Andrew Lewis, and many South Lake Union organizations since March of 2021, and since June of 2021 with City Light, the property owner, to make this site available to meet this critical need. Now we expect to finalize this plan with Mayor Bruce Harrell's administration.

The Mirabella Seattle Foundation and Mirabella residents have raised \$143,000 to support development costs of a Tiny House Village in SLU, which we had expected to be built in 2021. We understand LIHI is offering to use our pledge and other private sector donations to cover 50% of the development costs of the Tiny House Village at South Lake Union. We trust KCRHA will welcome this opportunity to leverage its finite public dollars through this public private partnership and support LIHI's Tiny House Village in South Lake Union.
